

## Cleaning & Care Instructions

## **TOILETS**

For the best results when caring for your PARISI products, follow the instructions carefully and use only the cleaning products suggested below. The use of other cleaning products may damage or discolor your product and potentially affect the functionality.

Always test the cleaning solution on an inconspicuous area before applying to the entire surface. Wipe surfaces clean and rinse completely with water immediately after applying cleaner.

Do not close the toilet seat throughout the cleaning process of the pan; it is recommended to remove the toilet seat while cleaning the pan. Use toilet bowl cleaners on the inside of the bowl only.

Modern toilet seats are designed to be easily removable to assist in correct maintenance of the toilet suites.

While there are several removal methods ranging from depressing a button to release, to a more simple lift-off design, they all provide easy access to the fixings as well as all the ceramic surfaces for correct cleaning. This also reduces the possibility of harsh and corrosive cleaning agents finding their way into the soft-close mechanism.

We also recommend cleaning with mild soapy water, ensuring that all surfaces are dried prior to re-attaching the seat.

Avoid in-tank cleaners as they can damage the flush valve or other working parts. Wipe any splashes of cleaner solutions from plastic or plated surfaces immediately. Over time, hard water deposits may clog toilet rim holes & trap ways.

To handle this problem, purchase a commercial cleaner that's recommended for the removal of hard water deposits and follow all instructions on the package.

All of our Rimless toilets include PARISI's Easy Clean Ceramic Glaze whereby active silver ions are baked into the glaze which dramatically decreases the build up of bacteria. This eliminates the need for harsh cleaning products including bleaches, thus creating a positive impact to the environment.

## What is vitreous china?

Vitreous china is formed from ceramic-clay similar to wall or floor tile and is specially glazed to have a glass-like or "vitreous" surface. This glass like surface is what gives vitreous china its name and characteristic.
